

Others have had medical challenges, and a bit of unexpected JOY is a balm during trying times. Pastor Sheila personally delivered the fifteen stockings during Christmas week.



### Supporting Afghan Refugees in Wyoming

As you may remember, your Church Council voted unanimously to work with the Wyoming Episcopal Diocese, other denominations, and the Wyoming Migration Ministry, to move forward the support of Afghanistan refugee resettlement in Wyoming. While Laramie has been selected as the first city where refugee resettlement will take place, Sheridan has also been selected for future refugee resettlement. As Wyoming is the only state never to accept refugees, this is a big task.

These refugees have a whole lot of support from U.S. veterans, former soldiers and Marines, as these Afghans fought side by side with Americans who depended on them in Afghanistan. Their Christmas wish is the gift of kindness when they get here. We will keep you up to date on their progress. What you can do in the meantime, is pray that Wyoming will find "room at the inn" for them.
