December 14, 2021 - Church Council Minutes (excerpts)

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Ron. Present were Pastor Anne and Council members: Ron McPhee, Larry Gerard, Deane Bjerke, Don Scantling, Barb Millett, Judy Firnekas and church secretary, Kathleen McPhee. The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Anne.

The Minutes of the November 9 Council meeting were approved as was the Treasurer's Report. The two investment accounts values have dropped recently, but the aggregate increase in value for the year is still over \$155,000. A company in the church stock portfolio that fell to 2 stars was replaced with a 5-star stock in accordance with the Finance Committee's strategy.

2022 Budget Draft. Council reviewed a draft Budget for 2022 revised as directed at the November Council meeting. The Council approved the draft Budget and will recommend it for approval at the Congregational Annual meeting in January.

Pastor's Report. The book Bible Study at St. Luke's. meets at 10 a.m. on Tuesdays. UCC is invited to attend. Pastor Anne is also leading an Advent Bible Study on Sunday evenings at UCC and by zoom. A Bible Study of an Overview of the Bible will start in mid-January on Thursdays at 10 a.m.

Pastor Anne will lead a "Blue Christmas" gathering on December 21 at St. Luke's Lutheran for those grieving for lost loved ones in 2021.

The Prayer Shawl Ministry delivered 5 prayer shawls this month. More shawls are available for delivery to those in need of comfort.

St. Luke's Lutheran Women's Group has invited UCC and St. Luke's Episcopal to join them for a Funny, Fuzzy, Fur luncheon Wednesday, December 15, at 12:30 p.m.

Pastor Anne's husband Scott will be having surgery on December 23 in California and she will take family leave during his recovery in the first week of January.

Buildings and Grounds. Larry has three smoke alarms to install in the parsonage. Ron and Eric will help dispose of the old snowblower. Action on a bid received from Alpine Construction of \$13,787 to replace the ramp to the Council Room was tabled until next spring. The cost for remodeling the stairway in the parsonage was approved.

Mission Committee: UCC purchased four Thanksgiving meals through the Food Pantry. Gifts will be collected for our new Adopted Family for Christmas. UCC and St. Luke's will participate in the Christmas dinner for Meals on Wheels on Christmas Day.

Worship Committee: John Egan will be available to provide music for our worship services starting on January 2.

Old Business:

Subscribing to a music copyright licensing company will be investigated next month. Council tabled a decision on joining the Buffalo Chamber until next year. Council was reminded that UCC is invited to the St. Luke's Children's program on December 19th at 9 a.m.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
