#### TIOSPAYE

Before joining the United Church of Christ (UCC), my experience of "church seasons" was the first Sunday in October ("promotion Sunday") when I would graduate to the next class; fall revival; Christmas; Easter; spring revival; Vacation Bible



school immediately following the end of school. What a surprise when I first joined the UCC shortly before the church's Pancake Supper for Fat Tuesday! I had never heard of Fat Tuesday nor a Pancake Supper to celebrate it.

So here in this church we have had a Pancake Supper on March 1, followed by Ash Wednesday, which we shared with the Lutherans. I have come to cherish these church seasons as I now have come to understand them. There is a satisfying rhythm to them, each with its own particular focus.

Lent originated early after Jesus' death though at the time its structure varied according to the region. A common practice was weekly fasting on Wednesday and Friday until mid-afternoon. In addition, candidates for baptism, as well as the clergy, would fast before the rite, which often took place at Easter.

During the fourth century, based on the timeframe of Jesus' reported time in the wilderness after his baptism, various Christian communities observed a longer fast of 40 days before the beginning of the three holiest days of the liturgical year: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.

As Christianity spread through Western Europe from the fifth through twelfth centuries, the observance of Lent did as well. A few Lenten days were "black," or total, fast days. But daily fasting came gradually to be moderated during most of Lent. By the end of the Middle Ages a meal was often permitted at noon.

Also, bishops and theologians specializing in

church law specified restrictions on the kinds of acceptable food: no meat or meat products, dairy or eggs could be consumed at all during Lent, even on Sundays.

The idea was to avoid self-indulgence at this time of repentance for one's sins. Marriage, a joyous ritual, was also prohibited during the Lenten season. I never have fasted for Lent, but I am considering doing some modified version. The suggested regimen is to fast on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** with only one simple meal during the day, usually without meat. Refrain from eating meat on all Fridays in Lent, substituting fish for example. Eliminate a food or food group for the entire season. Especially consider saving rich and fatty foods for Easter.

Other activities are also suggested, in keeping with the idea of Lent as a time for spiritual renewal as well as self-discipline. These include making amends with estranged family and friends, offering community service, and giving special attention to the reading of the Bible or other spiritual writings and to prayer.

Though some practices may have changed, Lent in the 21<sup>st</sup> century remains essentially the same as in centuries past: a time of quiet reflection and spiritual discipline. (Portions adapted from The Conversation, an online news source).



## TeamWorks report

Our church learned about JustHope from our former minister Randy Leisey. Its founder, Leslie Penrose, began working to address systemic poverty in

Nicaragua in 1986. Our church and our TeamWorks have supported its microcredit program, which provides small loans to women to start a small business in order to support their families. In one area nine women signed up this year to begin a pig breeding or agriculture business. Four new women have applied this year; it requires \$350 in new capital for each additional woman: \$250 for the loan and \$100 for the 3 years training and coaching they receive.

Women are responsible for each other's loans so local women are involved in reviewing applications for new loans. They can recognize women in their community who are a trustworthy credit risk. Since 2009 this microcredit program has provided over \$50,000 in microcredit loans to 157 women through 15 community microcredit banks in Nicaraguan villages. After 10 years, the women's repayment rate continues to be 100%.

Beth notes that in 2020 we sent \$800 (\$400 from the raffle of Rhonda's beautiful afghan, \$200 from Mission, and \$200 from TeamWorks), which paid the salary for the woman running the microcredit program. FINANCIAL REPORT: Matches Treasurer. The

2022 pledges already submitted is 1/3 of Budget.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Bank balance, prepaid pledges for the last few years were being transferred in our books but not with the bank. So the last few years prepaid pledges were transferred from Savings to Checking which put a lot in checking account. Memorial funds on annual report were wrong but now balances with memorial committee. RBC Wealth went down \$1041.18; Jim working on analysis for investing. One needs to submit slip for reimbursement; slips are in copy room.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT: Jerry would like Trustees to reconsider on investing in the audio/video equipment, eg TV+DVD player for Fellowship hall. Put up a curtain over the coat area to cover shovels, etc. The Door/bench moved to Stulce home; Kate will donate to church for it.

DIACONATE: Bingo on 2/27. Jerry & Rhonda will bring chili; Mary soup. Changing Bingo prizes to \$1 a card/Bingo winner takes the pot. (Mary got prizes for kids.) Need to look at inactive members. On 3/6 Jerry and Joan will go to Rapelje café and hope others church go also. Jerry has stored the 7 Accordion oak doors from between the sanctuary and East room; would like to have them removed. Maurie will take 2; Mary will take 2. \$200 apiece.

CHRISTIAN ED: Jerry mentioned Fat Tuesday. Conference schedule of summer camps for youth, family, & intergenerational at Mimanagish on bulletin boards. Or ask Joan to email it to you.

MISSION: Mission balance stands at \$2,487.65. Received thank you from the Mental Health Center, Montana Food Bank Network, JustHope. Donations went to two young men bicycling thru the area to raise environment awareness & received thank you.

TEAMWORKS: Served lunch served at our Annual Meeting and on Feb. 24 for Columbus Foundation. Website & Beth's report on JustHope on this page.

MEMORIAL: Nothing new. Balance is \$6,277.68.

PASTOR'S REPORT: "Much of my time recently has been consumed with meetings with Tonia Fisher for Lenten services and with Meg Hatch to do joint activities with Absarokee. I have walked at the high school and met more people in the community. Also joined a book club and met more folks that way. I have done some home visits and several in-office visits. Looking ahead - want to increase the variety in our worship services (inc. more recorded music played prior to the service) and a mission activity of resuming the work of

filling backpacks at Project Hope."
