




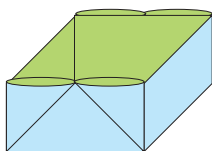
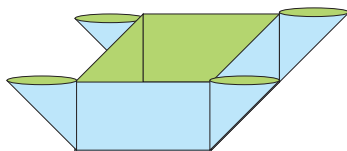
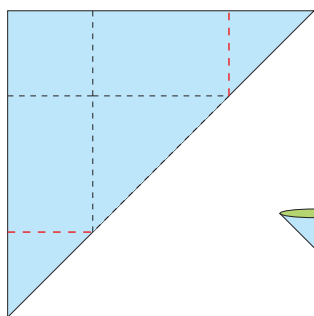
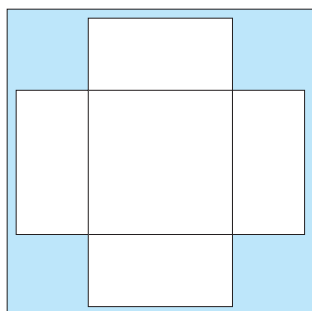
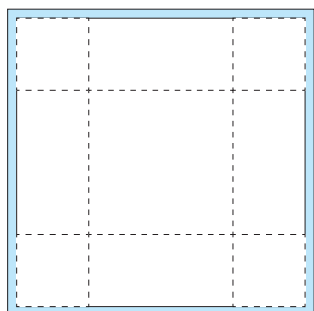
# Fabric Baskets

Who doesn't need extra storage in their sewing room? - Having too many rigid containers often add to the clutter.

I found a way to keep my sewing supplies organized using fabric baskets, which if you are done using them, can be folded and put away.

## Cutting Instructions

	Fabrics/Fleece	Fabric Basket - Large	Fabric Basket - Medium	Fabric Basket - Small
	Fabric 1	1 - 16½" square*	1 - 12½" square	1 - 8½" square
	Fabric 2	1 - 16" square	1 - 12" square	1 - 8" square
	Fusable Fleece	1 - 16" square	1 - 12" square	1 - 4" square centered
	Fabric Bottom Size	8" square	6" square	4" square
	Cut away corners	4 - 4" squares	4 - 3" squares	no need to fuse sides.



Fabric may be cut 1/2" larger than the fusible fleece.

Mark, then cut away 4" squares at corners of the fusible fleece.

Fuse the fleece to wrong side of fabric 1 and trim to 16" square.

Sew the fused fabric 1 and fabric 2 right sides together. Leave a 4" opening on one side and turn pillow style.

Press and stay-stitch all the way around 1/8" from the edge of the square. This closes the opening.

Mark lines right along the fusible inside as shown. Stitch on lines to help create the basket shape.

Fold fabric into triangle. Stitch on red lines. Open triangle and refold in same way to stitch the two remaining corners. Remember to back-stitch.

Form basket and open triangle corners to re-inforce basket corners or stitch them flat along opposite sides.

Use this method to make baskets of any size. Make sure the piece you cut away from the fleece corners is squares to keep basket sides even.

Start with a square or rectangle for the basket bottom then add equal width sides to make basket as high as desired.
