Farewell Letter from Pastor Jennifer

7/21/22

Dear Friends in Christ,

This letter comes to you from a heart filled with gratitude for our shared ministry during the past four years I've served as your senior pastor. It's been a strange, creative, terrifying, beautiful, and grace-filled ride. We went from having a calendar filled with so many activities barely anyone could keep track in early 2020, to doors shut and the building sealed for weeks...then months, then open, shut, then re-opened again.

We've cried tears of grief and joy together at church and in other places around this community. We've experienced pre-recorded, livestreamed, FaceBooked, YouTubed, and Zoomed ways of worship and being together. We've been inside, outside, up close, socially-distanced, masked and unmasked. We kept church being church even when we couldn't be at or in the building.

In this stage of the pandemic (which all of us wish was over but isn't) everything is different than it was. Everything is becoming something new. That truth can be exhausting or exhilarating, sometimes all in the same moment. The Holy Spirit has so much more truth and light to break forth from God's Holy Word, which is all of you!

Now here's the part no one likes to read or to write, for that matter. Although I have loved you deeply and dearly as your pastor, my departure means that I will not provide any

pastoral services or support to you after July 24th. That means no weddings, memorials, baptisms, blessings, or pastoral care. Furthermore, our code of ministerial ethics now recommends no contact (including social media) for at least a year following the pastor's departure date.

That means I will be unfollowing or unfriending UCC Missoula folk from my Facebook and Instagram accounts. Please don't take these actions personally! It also means that, although several of you have said sweet things about wanting to visit us in our new home on the Oregon coast, we'll need to wait until at least the summer of 2023 to walk the beach together. This separation time is intended to create the space needed to develop healthy relationships with your new pastor(s) as I trust you will.

It is my great hope that you will find leadership who cherishes this congregation as much as I do. I am certain God will continue to do great things with this church in the days and years to come.

Ellen and I thank you for your kindness, for your witness, and for your gracious care for us. We will miss UCC Missoula in so many ways, and now we appreciate you sending us off to make new dreams come true. God bless and keep you all, beloveds.

Remember the Gospel--God loves you; now go and do likewise!

Hello all,

The week for UCC and Missoula Friends Meeting to host Family Promise at the Family Housing Center is July 25-31st.

Volunteers for both service and supplies are needed in the following areas:

DINNERS We will need volunteers to provide salads and desserts and assist in the kitchen from 5-8ish pm. There are slots for salad, desserts, and volunteers. Ideally it would be great if you can bring a food item and stay to volunteer. Be sure to sign up for both if you can do both.

SALADS AND DESSERTS : All food needs to be purchased or prepared in our semi commercial licensed kitchen. We are asking for donations of green salad and vegetables, fruits and canned fruit and desserts spread out through the week.

KITCHEN HELPERS should arrive by 5:00 pm. Set up will be from 5-5:30 and we will serve and clean from 5:30-8, or whenever everyone is finished.

Note that on Saturday and Sunday, leftovers are served- if you are creative in making meals out of leftovers- please signup for one of those nights!

EVENING HOST- We no longer need to have volunteers stay overnight. We are asking for folks to continue to work the reception area from 8 to 10 pm to let residents in. There will be an awake YWCA staff also available on that shift.
