The Architect of the Capitol (AOC) is a legislative branch agency serving Congress and the Supreme Court as the builder and steward of the landmark buildings and grounds of Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. The AOC is committed to providing an environment for inspiring experiences for all who work and visit this symbol of American democracy.

We are honored to represent the legislative branch in engaging with tribal leaders or their designated representatives to seek input on a proposed project to display the official flags of federally recognized tribes on the Capitol campus. The AOC has been authorized to lead the initiative's outreach through the Fiscal Year 2020 Legislative Branch Appropriations Act (https://www.govinfo.gov/content/pkg/CREC-2019-12-17/pdf/CREC-2019-12-17-house-bk3.pdf) and requests your help to determine:

- Whether your tribe has an official flag or plans to adopt a flag in the future
- Whether you are interested in having your tribe's flag displayed on the Capitol campus

To assist the agency with providing recommendations to Congress on this important endeavor, the AOC has partnered with Kauffman & Associates, Inc. (KAI), a Native-owned firm.
